About the speaker:

Adrian WONG (BSc(Hon)(McMaster), MSocSc(Clin Psych)(HKU), PhD(CUHK)) is a Research Assistant Professor at Department of Medicine and Therapeutics, Faculty of Medicine, The Chinese University of Hong Kong. Prof Wong validated the Hong Kong version of the Montreal Cognitive Assessment (HK-MoCA) that is widely used in the public healthcare settings in Hong Kong. He is also the co-director of the STRIDE (Stroke Registry Investigating Cognitive Decline) study that is one of the largest studies aimed to investigate the long-term cognitive and psychological consequences after stroke or transient ischemic attack.

Timothy KWOK (MBChB(Leic), MD(Leic), FRCP(Lond), FHKCP, FHKAM(Medicine)) graduated from University of Leicester in the UK and received specialist training in Geriatric and Internal Medicine in St George's Hospital in London before returning to Hong Kong, to join the Department of Medicine & Therapeutics in the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK). He obtained his MD in 2004. He was promoted to professorship in 2006. For three years, he was chief of service of the Department of Medicine and Geriatrics in Taipo Hospital. He is director of Jockey Club Centre for Positive Ageing, a comprehensive care centre for people with dementia, and the Jockey Club centre for osteoporosis care and control. His research interests include dementia, nutrition, osteoporosis, palliative care and health services.
