Prof. June Andrews

Professor June Andrews RMN, RGN, FRCN is an inspirational woman whose impact on healthcare in the UK, and further afield, is profound. She works independently to improve dementia care.

Professor Andrews made ambitious things happen during her decade directing Stirling's Dementia Services Development Centre. She conceived of an online design guide for care homes and hospitals, ensuring wall-to-wall media coverage and heightened public and professional awareness of the practical things you can do to make life better for people with dementia. Now leaving that behind, she works independently to improve the lives of people with dementia and their careers.

She has worked in many countries including the Netherlands, France, Germany, Belgium, Switzerland, Ireland, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, Singapore, Saudi Arabia, and Hong Kong; she has been an adviser to the Canadian Knowledge Translation Network, and judged awards for the European Foundations in Dementia and the NHS and Design Council.

She received the Fellowship of the Royal College of Nursing (RCN), the highest honour awarded to nurses in the UK who have made an exceptional contribution to health care.

June supports other health and social care teams as a coach and mentor, and has led successful teams for three decades. Because of her considerable achievements as a nurse leader, she received the Chief Nursing Officers' Lifetime Achievement Award in 2012. In 2013 she was listed in the Health Services Journal as one of the fifty most inspirational women in health care and separately as one of the 100 most influential clinicians in England. In 2016 she was awarded the OBE.
